REQUIREMENTS TO PARTICIPATE: Students at any grade level, 9-12, may participate. Successful participation in each competition qualifies the student for participation at the next contest level.

ACTIVITY DESCRIPTION: Forensics provides students with an opportunity to develop their skills in public speaking and oral interpretation of literature.
